## Transporting Children with Special Health Care Needs

This course will introduce participants to medical conditions that can impact child safety restraint selection and provide the opportunity to investigate and install specialized restraint systems. The training, which lasts two days, combines classroom lectures, discussions & hands-on exercises including the opportunity to interact with families and assess the transportation needs of their children.

### Objectives

Upon completion of this course, participants should be able to:

- Identify categories of medical conditions and procedures that require special transportation related to characteristics of those conditions and procedures
- Explain considerations for special needs restraint selection and list general guidelines or use of specialized restraints.
- Describe the 5 categories of specialized restraints.
- Identify types of misuse shared by standard and specialized restraints.
- Identify misuse unique to positioning children in and installation of specialized restraints.
- Identify guidelines for school bus transportation and explain the purpose of an Individualized Education Plan (IEP).

### Who Should Attend?

Anyone working with special health care needs children should attend, including:

- Physical and Occupational Therapists
- Health Dept. and Hospital staff
- School/Medical transportation planners and drivers
- Special needs advocacy groups

This course is specifically designed for individuals who have completed Child Passenger Safety Technician (CPST) training. Upon completion of this training, participants will be provided with certification of attendance and **will earn 6 CPST** continuing education credits and can choose to be listed in the National Center for Safe Transportation of Children with Special Health Care Needs database as an available community resource.
